#### **Quilter Basics**

- Please read all instructions before beginning.

Fabric 1 – Cut 1 – 10%"xWOF strip

Subcut 1 - 10%" x10%" square cut once diagonally for baskets

Use remainder for outer border

**Fabric 2** – Cut 9 –  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "xWOF strips for binding

**Fabric 3** – Cut 2 – 33/8"xWOF strips

Subcut 20 − 33/8" x33/8" squares cut once diagonally

Cut 2 - 3"xWOF strips

Subcut 16 - 3"x3" squares

Cut  $4 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ "xWOF strips

Subcut  $36 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ "x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for

half square triangles

**Fabric 4** – Cut 2 – 3"xWOF strips

Subcut 20 - 3"x3" squares

Cut  $4 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ "xWOF strips

Subcut  $40 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for

half square triangles

**Fabric 5** – Cut  $3 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ "xWOF strips

Subcut  $24 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for

half square triangles

Cut 1 - 3"xWOF strip

Subcut 12 - 3"x3" squares

**Fabric 6** – From fat quarter cut  $8 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ "x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and

4 - 3"x3" squares

**Fabric** 7 – Cut 1 – 10% "x WOF strip

Subcut 3 − 10%"x 10%" squares cut

once diagonally for baskets

Cut  $2 - 3\frac{3}{8}$ "xWOF strips

Subcut 12 - 3%" x3%" squares cut once diagonally

From remainder of strip cut 8 - 3"x3" squares

Cut  $2 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ "xWOF strip

Subcut  $16 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for half square triangles

**Fabric 8** – Cut 2 - 10% "x WOF strips

Subcut 4 - 10%" x 10%" squares cut

once diagonally for baskets

From remainder of strips cut

 $20 - 3\frac{3}{8}$ " x  $3\frac{3}{8}$ " squares cut once diagonally

4 - 3"x3" squares and

 $4 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x3½" squares for half square triangles

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**Fabric 9** – Cut 2 - 10%"x WOF strips

Subcut 6 − 10% "x 10% " squares cut

once diagonally for baskets

Cut  $1 - 3\frac{3}{8}$ "xWOF strip

Subcut 12 - 3%" x 3%" squares cut once diagonally

**Fabric 10** − Cut 2 − 10%"x WOF strips

Subcut 4 − 10%"x 10%" squares cut

once diagonally for baskets

**Fabric 11** − Cut 1 − 33/8"xWOF strip

Subcut  $8 - 3\frac{3}{8}$ " x  $3\frac{3}{8}$ " squares cut once diagonally

Cut 1 – 3"xWOF strip

Subcut 8 - 3"x3" squares

Cut  $2 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ "xWOF strip

Subcut  $16 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for half square triangles

Half Square Triangles (HST) – The following steps apply to all half square triangle units in this quilt.

- 1. Using a mechanical pencil draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all 3½"x3½" Fabric 4, 5 and 6 squares.
- 2. With right sides together, align edges of Fabric 3, 7, 8, or 11 (3½"x3½") squares with their marked light square. See diagram below for fabric combinations.
- 3. Stitch ¼" on opposite sides of marked line.
- 4. Cut on marked line. Press toward dark side. Square up half square triangle units to measure 3"x3"with seams.



#### Piecing a Basket Block

The following parts are needed for each basket block:

1 – 3"x3" background square, 1– 3"x3" print square, 4 half square triangle (HST 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, or 6) units,

 $4 - 3\frac{3}{8}$ " triangles and  $1 - 10\frac{7}{8}$ " basket triangle.

Refer to the chart below for the quantity for each block and fabric placement. Make a total of 36 blocks.

#### Step 1:

Join 1 bkgd. square, 2 – HST units and  $1 - 3\frac{3}{8}$ " triangle. Press.












Step 4: Join the rows from Steps 1-3. Press.




#### Step 2:

Join 1 HST unit, 1 – Print square and  $1 - 3\frac{3}{8}$ " triangle. Press.










#### Step 5:

Add large basket triangle to pieced triangles. Press. Block should measure  $10\frac{1}{2}$ "x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " with seams.



#### Step 3:


Join 1 HST unit, and 2 - 3%" triangle. Press.











Make 36 Block should measure 101/2"x101/2" with seams.



## Rssemble Quilt

Refer to diagram for block placement.

- 1. Piece blocks into rows. Press seams in opposite directions.
- 2. Join rows to make quilt quarters 2 with Block 6 Basket 1 and 2 with Block 6 Basket 2.
- 3. Join quarters (with like center baskets opposite each other) to make quilt top. Press. Quilt top should measure 60½"x60½" with seams.

# Quilt Quarter – Make 4 Each quarter should measure 30½" with seams



## Final Border

Fussy cut (or tear)  $4 - 8\frac{1}{2}$ " x Length of fabric border strips. See diagram.



- 1. Measure the quilt top from top to bottom through the center. Trim the 2 center border strips to that measurement (approx. 60½"). Add to opposite sides of the quilt top. Press seams toward border. Note: Flowers in border strips should be running in opposite directions as the border flowers will "chase" each other around the quilt top.
- 2. Measure quilt top from side to side including the borders. Cut the 2 outside border strips to that measurement (approx. 76½"). Add to top and bottom of quilt. Press toward border. Quilt should measure 76½"x76½" with seams.

## Finishing

Using a bias seam, join the  $9 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ "xWOF strips end to end. Press seams open. Fold prepared strip in half wrong sides together and press to make the binding.

Layer, Quilt and Bind.
