----- Fabric Requirements -----

- 1 Layer Cake or Fat Eighth Bundle
- 1 White Jr. Layer Cake
- 1 White Jr. Jelly Roll
- 1 yard border fabric
- 1/2 yards binding
- 3 yards backing
- Twin batting or a piece at least 60" x 60"



*You can replace the Jr. layer cake and Jr. jelly roll for 1 1/2 yards neutral fabric.

*Quilt finishes at 54" x 54"

*RST means right sides together

* All seams 1/4"

*HST means half square triangles

----- Cutting Instructions -----

From the neutral fabric cut:

- 35 squares 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"
sub-cut once diagonally
- 16 squares 6 1/4" x 6 1/4"
sub-cut twice diagonally
- 27 strips measuring 2 1/2" x 8 3/4"
- 7 strips measuring 2 1/2" x 42"



From the patterned fabric cut:

- 80 squares 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"



From the border fabric cut:

- 4 strips 5" x 42"
- 4 strips 5" x 20"

----- Piecing Instructions -----

- Once your pieces are cut, grab 5 patterned squares and 4 of the bigger neutral triangles (cut from your 6 1/4" squares). Lay them out as shown.



- Sew in rows diagonally.



- On the corner rows, press the seams in.



- On the middle row, press the seams out.



- Join the rows together, nesting seams as you go



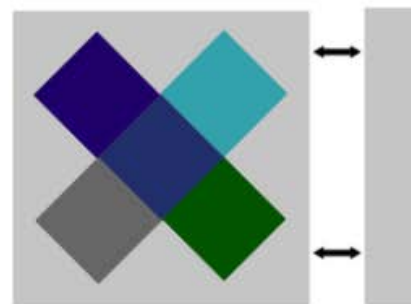
- Sew the smaller triangles (cut from your 3 1/2" squares) onto each corner.



- Square up to 8 3/4" x 8 3/4"

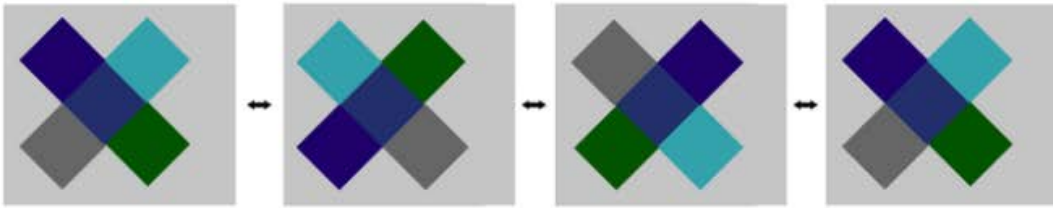


- Continue until you have 16 blocks. Sew a 2 1/2" x 8 3/4" sashing strip to the right side of each block to prepare for quilt top assembly.

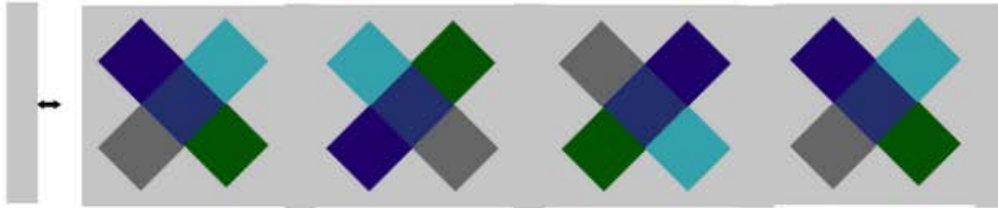


-----Quilt Top Assembly-----

Lay out your blocks into a row of 4. Sew the blocks together to make one row.

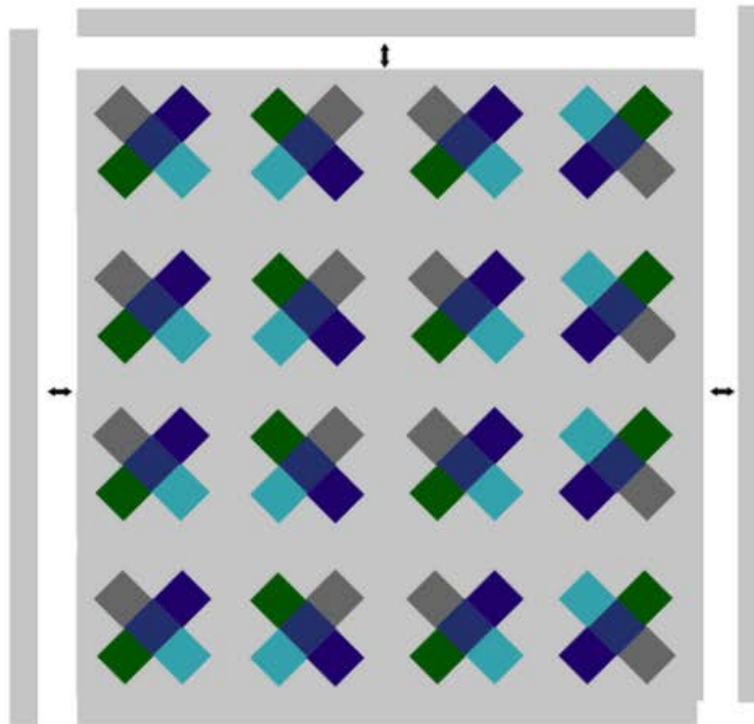


Sew another small sashing strip to the left side of the row. Repeat until you have 4 rows.



Sew a large sashing strip (2 1/2" x 42") to a small sashing strip (2 1/2" x 8 3/4") to create one larger sashing strip. Repeat until you have 7. Sew a long sashing strip to the top of each row.

Joins all the rows together. Sew your another strip to the bottom of the quilt top. Trim the edges. Sew your final 2 strips to either side of the quilt top. Press seams open.



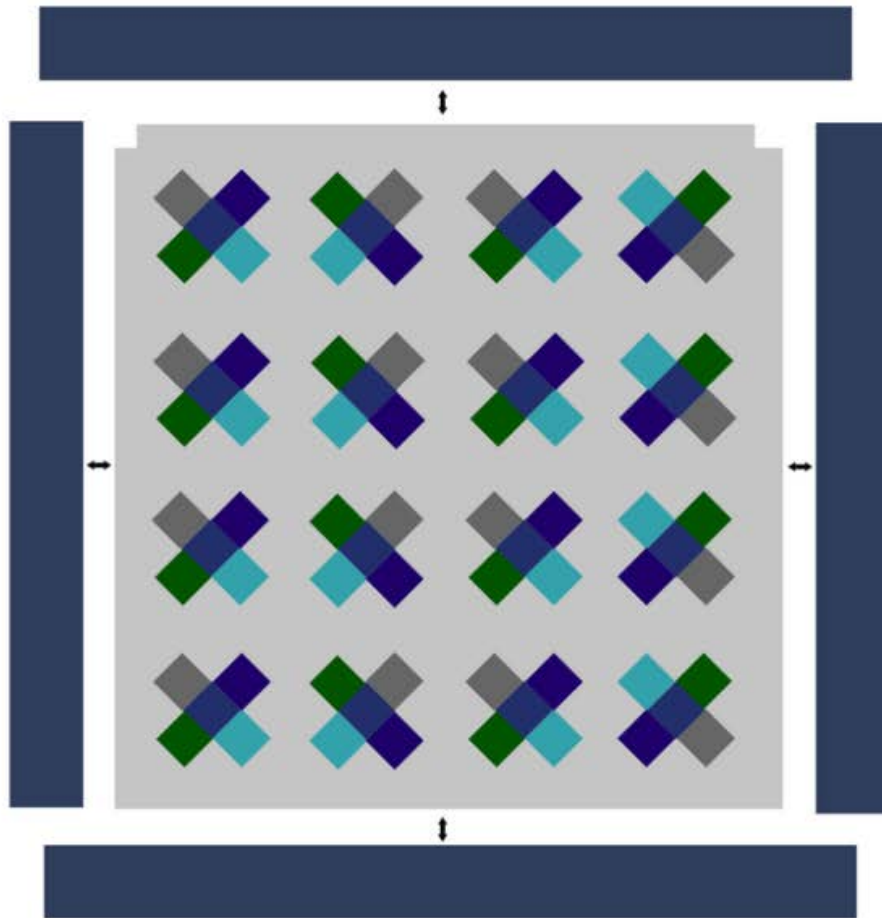
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Sew the small a small and long border fabric strip together. Repeat until you have 4. Sew two onto opposite sides. Trim the edges and press seams open. Sew the other two onto the other sides. Trim edges and press seams open. Baste, quilt and bind as desired.
