## INSTRUCTIONS

1 Use the corresponding precuts to cut 1 large square and 4 small squares for desired size flying geese.

2 Draw a diagonal line on the back of all of the smaller squares.


3Line up two smaller squares along the diagonal of a larger square, right sides together (the middles will overlap). Sew $1 / 4$ " away from the center line on both sides.


4Cut on the center line. Press the units, pressing the seam allowance toward the smaller triangles. Take care not to distort the fabric when pressing.


5 Line a smaller square up with the corner as shown. Sew $1 / 4$ " away from the center line on both sides. Cut on the center line.


Press the units toward the smaller triangles. Again, take care not to distort the fabric when pressing. Trim to size.

## YIELD

The combination of 1 large square with 4 small squares yields 4 flying geese.
